The UnitedHealth Premium Program evaluates physicians in various specialties using evidence-based medicine and national standardized measures to help you locate quality and cost-efficient providers. It's easy to find a UnitedHealth Premium Care Physician. Just go to **myuhc.com®** and click on "Find a Doctor." Choose smart. Look for blue hearts.

Quality is evaluated on evidence-based medicine and national industry guidelines. Cost-efficiency standards rely on local market benchmarks for the efficient use of resources in providing care. A doctor's Premium designation is shown on **myuhc.com** and in provider directories.

1. What are the possible UnitedHealth Premium designations?

There are several possible Premium designations for a doctor. Doctors who have met the criteria for quality and/or cost efficiency could have one of these four UnitedHealth Premium designations.

These designations are shown on **myuhc.com** and in provider directories.

The fact that a doctor does not have a quality designation does not mean that the doctor does not provide quality health services. All doctors who are part of the UnitedHealthcare network must meet our standard credentialing requirements (separate from the Premium program).



Premium Care Physician

The physician meets the criteria for providing quality and cost-efficient care.



Quality Care Physician

The physician meets the criteria for providing quality care.



Quality Not Evaluated

The physician does not have enough claims data to be evaluated for quality, so the physician is not eligible for the cost-efficient care designation.



Does Not Meet Quality

The physician does not meet the criteria for providing quality care, so the physician is not eligible for the cost-efficient care designation.

If a doctor does not have a Premium designation, it does not mean he or she provides a lower standard of care. It could mean that the data available to us was not sufficient to include the doctor in the program. All doctors who are part of the UnitedHealthcare network must meet our credentialing requirements (separate from the Premium program).

4. How is cost measured as a part of the UnitedHealth Premium Program?

The Premium program has a long history of addressing the variation in quality and cost of health care. The cost-efficiency standards are based on the care provided to a patient during the entire treatment for a condition. It can include the appropriate use of diagnostic testing, prescribed medications, any related procedures, and follow-up care and associated costs. The evaluation also factors in surgical redo rates and any complication-related costs.
